- Cornelia Sorabji (15 November 1866 6 July 1954)
- An Indian woman who was the first female graduate from Bombay University, the first woman to study law at Oxford University (the first Indian national to study at any British university the first female advocate in India, and the first woman to practice law in India and Britain.

Wabi-sabi



Japanese, noun wah-BEE sah-BEE

A state of acceptence of the imperfections in life and appreciating them as beautiful. Appreciating the flow of life.

- In traditional Japanese aesthetics, *Wabi-sabi* is a world view centered on the acceptance of transience and imperfection
- The aesthetic is sometimes described as one of beauty that is "imperfect, impermanent, and incomplete"
- Characteristics of the *wabi-sabi* aesthetic include asymmetry, roughness, simplicity, economy, austerity, modesty, intimacy, and appreciation of the ingenuous integrity of natural objects and processes.

Indira Nooyi



- Indra Krishnamurthy Nooyi is an Indian American business executive and the current Chairwoman and Chief Executive Officer of PepsiCo.
- She has consistently ranked among the World's 100 Most Powerful Women. In 2014, she was ranked at #13 on the list of Forbes World's 100 most powerful women, and was ranked the 2nd most powerful woman on the Fortune list in 2015.
- In February 2018, the International Cricket Council announced that Nooyi would join the ICC Board as its first independent female director in June.

Kintsugi

- Kintsugi ("golden joinery"), also known as Kintsukuroi ("golden repair"), is the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery with lacquer dusted or mixed with powdered gold, silver, or platinum.

J K Rowling



- Rowling has lived a "rags to riches" life story, in which she progressed from living on state benefits to being the world's first billionaire author.
- She is the United Kingdom's best-selling living author, with sales in excess of £238M.
- *Time* magazine named her as a runner-up for its 2007 Person of the Year, noting the social, moral, and political inspiration she has given to millions across the globe.
- She has supported charities including Comic Relief, One Parent Families, Multiple Sclerosis Society of Great Britain and then launched her own charity: Lumos.
