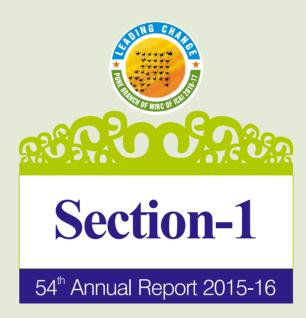

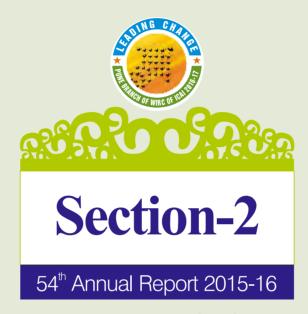

This was the third and last financial year for the Managing Committee for Council years 2013-2016 and the newly elected Managing Committee for council years 2016-2019 has assumed the office on 25th February, 2016.

The constructive cooperation, concrete support and guidance from the Central and Regional Council Members, Managing Committee Members, Past Chairmen of the Branch and Members of Pune at large helped us a lot to carry out various activities and initiatives for members and students during financial year 2015-2016.

Some of our major activities undertaken during the reporting year are as under:

A. Activities for Members:

i. Conferences / Seminars / Workshops / Lecture Meets for Members & Students:

The National Convention on Direct Taxes under the aegis of Direct Taxes Committee provided the latest updates and practical inputs to huge gathering of CA members.

The Union Budget-2016 Analysis program provided an in-depth analysis of various amendments in direct and indirect tax provisions.

With the Indirect Taxes regime set to undergo paradigm change with the expected GST era; lecture meets, workshops and seminars during the year created the required awareness amongst the fraternity. The Indirect Taxes Committee of ICAI organized a programme at Pune Branch, in which CA Upender Gupta, Additional Commissioner, GST Cell, CBEC, New Delhi provided valuable insight to the members.

The buzz words in the present socio economic scenario are Cyber Crime & IT security. The Branch organized few workshops on this subject and provided the practical inputs to the members.

Along-with the perennial programmes such as DTRC, ITRC, Convocation Ceremony etc. other programmes on some specific and practical importance subjects for e.g. 'Will' (Testamentary Document) its notion, Necessity, Drafting, Execution, Stamp Duty & Registrations, Agriculture Accounting, Advance Management Program, Articleship Development Program, the Young Members' Empowerment programs and Women CAs empowerment program and similar many others were conducted.

More than 50 Lecture Meets conducted at frequent periodicity on traditional as well on the off-beat topics were appreciated by the members.

This year more joint programs with WIRC, other Institutes and Organizations, & other branches etc. were organized.

ii. Study Groups for Research Papers, Pre & Post Budget Memorandum, & Suggestions on Exposure Drafts:

The Branch initiated the formation of various study groups for preparing the Research Papers, pre & post budget memorandam and suggestions on the Exposure drafts.

Many CA professionals contributed in this academic activity and put forth constructive ideas by way of creating Research Papers on the subjects given by ICAI, HO and also submitted various practical suggestions in pre & post budget memorandam & on Exposure Drafts.

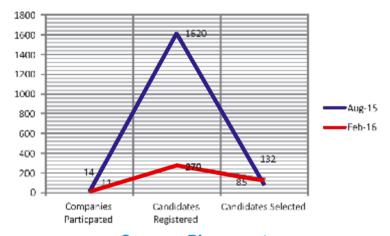

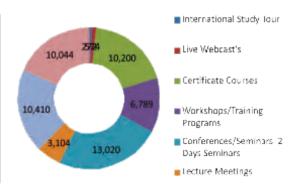

B. Activities for Students:-

I National Convention for CA Students:

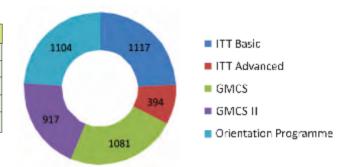

Interactive Voice Response System

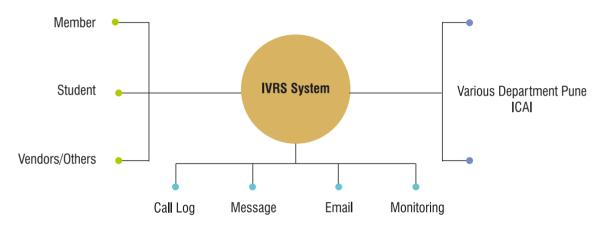
The year 2016-17 is a year of implementing changes to be more proactive towards the entire CA fraternity and students pursuing their career.

This is the first ever IVRS service in any branch of ICAI across the country.

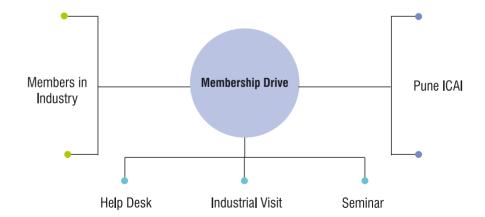

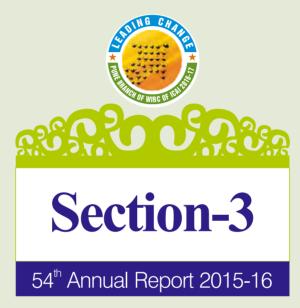
Integration members in Industry and Membership Drive

Independent Auditors Report To the Pune Branch of WIRC of ICAI

Report on the financial statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Pune Branch of WIRC of ICAI, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2016, and Income and Expenditure Account for the period from 01-April-2015 to 31-March-2016 and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that gives a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the Pune Branch in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including accounting standards prescribed by ICAI. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risk of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments; the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Pune Branch's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the it's internal control. An audit also include evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. We believe that audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for audit opinion.

 - a)Yes. Balance of petty cash book was reconciled with Bank and Cash Balances & are supported by vouchers & documentary evidence.

 - a) Yes. Follow up Action has been taken to recover the dishonored cheques/drafts subject to amount of Rs. 4,000/- towards cheque bounced is still not recovered from respective students since September 2013. The same has been written off as prior period income during Oct 15 to March 16.
- 5. Whether the assets purchases for the branch are properly recorded in the asset register and physical verification is carried out? Whether the capital items purchased by branch are out of the capital grant released to the branch?
 - a) The Fixed Asset Register is maintained and physical verification has been carried out.
 - **b)** Branch has sent the Preliminary Capital Budget to ICAI Head Office. However, following capital items are purchased which were not forwarded in Preliminary Capital Budget.

- 6. Whether Capital Grant Account and Inter Unit Balances with Regional council and Central Office are duly reconciled?
 - a) Inter Unit Transactions & Balances with Central Office in the specified format till 31-03-2016 has been sent to Head Office for their confirmation.
 - b) Inter Unit Balance with WIRC is duly reconciled till 31-03-2016.
 - c) Capital Grants are reconciled subject to point stated in 5 (b) above.

- 7. Whether stock register of stationery and publications are properly maintained and a physical verification is carried out?
 - a) Yes. Stock register for office stationery & publications is maintained subject to remarks in point 12(a) and physical verification conducted on test check basis for few items.
- 8. Whether the systems and procedures followed for purchases have been made based on the lowest quotations and/or the practices being followed?
 - a) Yes, Branch has followed the system of obtaining quotations for purchases of capital items & major revenue items if any. Also these purchases are based on lowest quotations which are being called for.
- 9. Whether the expenditure towards Seminar and conference are properly accounted for and met out of the resources generated by way of participation fee and seminar/CPE grant released by Head Office? The expenditure towards Seminar & Conference are properly accounted for and met out of the resources generated by way of participation fee and seminar/CPE grant released by Head Office subject to below mentioned points
 - **a)** Seminar Income is Rs. 78,03,682/- and Expenses are Rs. 74,05,865/-. Thus there is a Surplus of Rs. 3.97.817/-
- 10. Whether proper budgetary control is exercised with respect to both revenue and capital expenditure?
 - a) There is system of preparing the budget and getting it approved from the appropriate authorities, however on comparison of actual expenditure with the preliminary budget & revised budget for April 15 to March 16 of FY 2015-16, it is observed that actual income has lowered by 6% compared with budgeted income and actual expenditure has lowered by 1% compared with budgeted expenditure. Refer Annexure I.
 - b) Branch has sent the Preliminary & Revised Capital Budget to ICAI Head Office. Refer Point No. 5 (b).
- 11. Whether Salary and staff payments have been made according to decisions of the executive committee of the branch?
 - a) Salary and staff payments have been made according to decisions of the Managing Committee of the branch. However, during the FY 2014-15, ICAI has introduced the Branch Employee Scheme, 2014 and accordingly the Managing Committee has sent the recommendation asked under the same scheme.
- 12. Whether proper inventories have been kept of the publications received from Central Office from time to time and whether publication account along with sale proceeds and stock statement has been sent to head office on quarterly basis? It must also be ensured that AS-2 has been complied with.
 - a) There was difference in actual inventory & inventory as per books of accounts of publications received from Central Office from earlier years. During the year under consideration, Pune Branch has obtained Stock Audit Report from an Independent Practicing Chartered Accountant Firm stating actual inventory of publications as on the date of audit. Accordingly difference in physical inventory & book inventory worked out & the same difference has been accounted for in the books of accounts of the year under consideration.
 - **b)** As per the information received to us, Publication Account and Stock Statements have been forwarded to Delhi Head Office on quarterly basis.
- 13. Whether proper records have been kept for issue of study materials, suggested answers, revision test papers etc. sent by head office?
 - a) Proper Records for issue and receipt of study material etc. are kept in separate software.
- 14. Whether expenditure on postage, Freight and rent, rates & taxes have been properly accounted for?

 a) Yes. Expenditure has been properly accounted for as per commonly accepted accounting principles & practices.
- 15. Whether the news letter published by the branch is self supporting and proper accounting has been done for ascertaining its actual cost?
 - **a)** The expenditure on newsletter is Rs. 3,80,585/- while income from advertisement in newsletter is Rs. 1,99,430/-. The Management is of the opinion that, the information of seminars published in newsletters generates revenue which cannot be quantified as income thus it is self supporting.
 - b) Proper accounting has been done for ascertaining actual cost of the news letter publication.

- 16. Whether there are assets, which are no longer usable or discarded? A list of such items with particulars, date of acquisition and value should be given. Similarly, a list of obsolete/immovable stock with recommendations should be given.
 - a) Based on our verification we have found following asset which is no longer usable and disposed.
 - 1. Camera (Nikon L810) Rs. 8.597.67
- 17. Identification of areas of weak controls and to suggest ways and means of streamlining the same. Please give an independent and objective assessment and evaluation of each activity for better management control and financial discipline.
 - a) Efforts need to be taken to strengthen & monitor the stock inventory of Unsold Exam Forms.
- 18. Whether prescribed rates of depreciation have been followed while charging depreciation on fixed assets of the branch?
 - a) Depreciation is to be provided on written down value method at the rates approved by council. However, the Branch has worked out depreciation as per the Income Tax Act instead of Pro-rata monthly basis as prescribed under council guidelines.
- 19. Whether all the revenue grants received or receivable as per entitlement of the branch are duly accounted for in the books of accounts of the branch?
 - a) Yes, the Branch has accounted for all the Revenue Grants received or receivable during FY 2015-2016.
- 20. The fund of branch shall not be applied either directly or indirectly for making any payment to the members of Managing Committee except to reimburse them any expenses, incurred by them in connection with business of managing committee provided however that, no member of managing committee shall be entitled to claim any travelling or other allowances.
 - a) During the course of our audit, there are no such payments to the members of Managing Committee except to reimburse them any expenses incurred by them in connection with activities of Pune Branch of WIRC if any.

21. Other Matters:

- 1. Expenses shared with De centralized Office (DCO):
 Some expenses of the branch are shared with DCO in the ratio 60:40. However letter stating this ratio was received in 1998-99. And the same letter has been used as a basis for apportionment till the date. No further written correspondence stating ratio or the expenses to be shared is received by the branch.
- 2. As per Electricity bill Security deposit with Electricity department is Rs 2,29,200/-. Same is not appearing in the books of accounts of the branch.
- 3. The Branch has not provided for Statutory Audit Fees and Internal Audit Fees during the year because branch has received communication from the Head Office that the same would be provided in the books of Head Office.
- **4.** It has been observed that monthly Profession Tax Payment has been made. But PTRC Returns with respect to the same have not been filed. Also it is recommended to obtain new PTRC Registration number.
- 5. It is suggested to obtain relevant applicable legal registrations in connection with Salary to Staff such as Provident Fund etc. & to comply the same on regular basis as per law.
- **6.** Earmarked Funds Liability Account and Earmarked Fund Investments Account show difference of Rs. 95,521/- as on 31-March-2016.

Notes forming part of accounts for the year ended 31.03.2016

i. Accounting Convention:

The accounts are drawn up on historical cost basis and have been prepared in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards except where stated otherwise. The financial statements are prepared on mercantile basis.

ii. Revenue Recognition:

- **a.** Income on account of Interest on fixed deposits is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.
- b. Revenue Grant and Other Income are recognized as and when accrued.

iii, Allocations / transfer to maintenance fund:

Every year, 10% of the net surplus for the year is transferred to Maintenance Fund.

iv. Fixed assets / Depreciation:

- **a.** Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation. All costs relating to the acquisition and installation of fixed assets are capitalized.
- b. Depreciation is provided on the written down value method at the following rates as approved by the council

Computers 60%
Office Equipment 15%
Electrical Fittings 10%
Furniture & Fixtures 10%
Library Books 100%

- c. Depreciation on additions is provided as per the provision under the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- v. Exemption in respect of Income Tax been granted under-Section 10 (23) (iv) of the Income Tax Act 1961 at the Institute level.
 - Hence no provision for Income Tax, Deferred Tax Asset / Liability is considered necessary at the branch level.
- vi. Inventories of the publications received from Central Office have been maintained. However, there was difference in inventory from earlier years as no reconciliation with Central office was available. Pune branch has conducted stock audit from independent Chartered Accountant and has written offold difference of inventory amounting to Rs.19,87,424/-. The Closing balance of inventory of publications amounting to Rs.6,63,255/- appearing in the balance sheet is as certified by stock auditor.
- vii. Only direct attributable expenses on the activities of Publication of Newsletter and Seminars have been charged to these heads of expenditure and indirect expenditure on these activities is charged to functional heads of expenditure.
- viii. Service Tax Liability has not been provided at branch level as the same is administered centrally at Head office
- ix. Figures of the previous year have been grouped/regrouped wherever necessary.

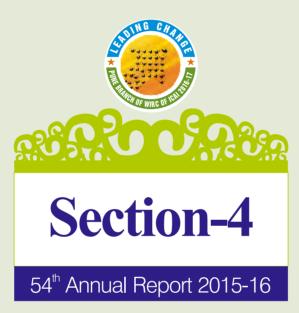

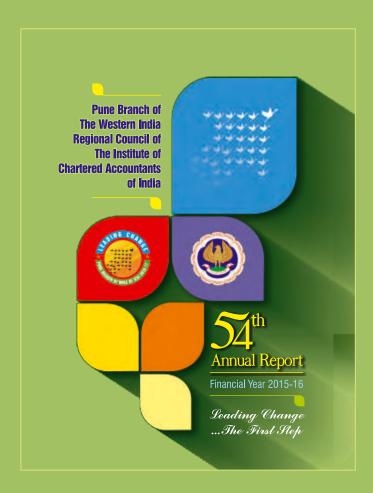
